Euclid Dues

The 2008 dues notices have been in the hands of the membership for at least the last three months. As of this writing there remains 33 members who have not responded. Several of these 33 also have two and three years back dues for which they are delinquent. The WM has appointed a special committee to

contact these delinquent brethren to find out why they have ignored their dues, and see if they can get current or at least get sufficient information from them that can be included in our report to the Grand Master seeking permission to suspend them for Non Payment of Dues. The lodge is required to pay the \$10.00 per capita tax per year



Past Master Highlight David D. Hess P.M. 1851

David D. Hess was born February 13, 1814 in Schoharie, Schoharie County, New York.

He was a Physician, Banker and Farmer.

About 1840, he moved to Naperville. He was a young, active, vigorous and well educated physician.

On November 14, 1847 he married Adela M. Wight, the Rev. Hope Brown officiating.

From this union they had five children, Walter, Adeline, Mary B., Harry and Margaret.

He served as the Naperville Township Supervisor in 1854.

He retired from his practice as a physician in 1857 and engaged in the banking business. At this time he also moved to Chicago where he took the superintendence of the Illinois Stone Company, in which he was a large stockholder and in which he always held some official position.

While situated in Chicago, in partnership with another gentleman, he built the business building located at the corner of Wabash Avenue and Monroe Street, in which the well-known music store of Root & Sons is located.

He returned to Naperville in 1861 and purchased over 300

acres of farming land along the DuPage River just west of the village. He improved and cared for it until it was deemed one of the model farms of the area.

Following the close of the War of the Rebellion, he built a substantial and elegant brick residence on Jefferson Avenue in the eastern part of the village.

He was the second Master of Euclid Lodge No. 65 and also served Euclid Chapter No. 13 as High Priest in 1854 and 1856.

He died April 15, 1885, in Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois.

on each delinquent member.

So you no longer want to be a Mason! It is not what you envisioned! You don't like a certain member or a couple of members etc. It is all right and we understand but there are correct ways to get out other than ignoring dues requests. At three times when you were at the altar in all three of your degrees the WM addressed you "as a man and a Mason". So now, that you no longer desire to be a Mason, that is no reason that you can't still be a man and handle your change of mind in a business like manner. Two simple steps is all it takes to get it done. (1) Pay your back and current dues. (2) At the same time, write and advise the lodge that you desire to terminate your membership with Euclid Lodge and request that a dimit be sent to you. That will get you off the membership rolls, stop the receipt of all Masonic mail, and stop the accumulation of back dues. A dimit can only be issued to a member that is current on the books at the time of the request. That is the reason for step (1) above. Should you at a later date decide to reactivate a Masonic interest, the dimit will be of great value.

As we have said many times before, if dues payment creates a financial burden, let the Worshipful Master or the Secretary know. We have means to help but we need to know before we can do any thing.
