From The East - Timothy Ory - Worshipful Master

It is hard to believe that it is May already. This marks the half-way point in Euclid Lodge's Masonic year. I have been reminding Brother Senior Warden that it won't be long before I will be turning over the gavel to him in the East. Are you ready Carl? We have had another busy month. At our stated meeting on April 3 we balloted on a petition for degrees and also our second invitation to petition, both of which were unanimous.

The "Invitation to Petition" program is fairly new in Illinois. If a Master Mason knows someone personally for at least two years. he can fill out an invitation to petition for that person and present it to the Lodoe for ballotino. Two other Master Masons must also sign the petition but do not need to know the person for two vears. If the ballot taken is unanimous then the person so named on the petition is presented with a folder containino a regular petition and additional information about our fraternity. He has 6 months to act but is not obligated to do so. The person named on the petition does not have an investigation committee come to visit him and his wife because the Lodge has already balloted on him. He does not have to worry about being rejected for membership. If you know someone that you believe would be an asset to the fraternity, and you have known them for at least two years, this is an excellent way to see if they have an interest in ioining the Lodge. Please see me if you would like more information about this prooram. On April 9, Brothers Carl Crownhart, Bill Ackerman and Wbro. Neville Diamond and Lattended the Grand Masters Town Hall meeting in Joliet. Most of the Grand Lodge Officers were in attendance and each gave a report on different facets of the operations of "Our" Grand Lodge. I make the point "Our" because that is exactly how the Grand Lodge Officers refer to it. The evening was very informative and Grand Master Terry Seward took and answered all questions from the participants. An ILCHIP event was held at Trinitv Lutheran Church in Lisle. About 45 children went through the procedures of the program and their parents were given the materials to help identify their children for the authorities in the event of their disappearance. It was a very good event. The Lodge conferred the 1st degree on two candidates at our special meeting, April 17. They are scheduled to receive their second degree on May 29th. Brothers Carl Crownhart, Vaneet Kapoor and I, along with our wives, attended the Masters Dinner at the Diplomat West in Elmhurst on April 20. This event is sponsored annually by the Northeastern District Deputy Grand Masters. We had the honor of being seated with the Grand Lodge's Right Worshipful Grand Senior Warden, Anthony Cracco. Tony is a great guy and should make a great Grand Master in a few years. We had a oreat time, a lot of oreat food. great company, most importantly, the speeches were short. Due to numerous conflicts with other Masonic events being held on Saturday, April 21, we had to cancel our Naper Boulevard cleanup. We will reschedule. On April 28, we held another ILCHIP event at the First Presbyterian Church of DuPage in Bolinabrook.

We will continue to be busy in May. We have a Table Lodge on the 7th, a blood drive on the 12th and degrees to be conferred on the 15th and 29th.

The Temple Board is busy planning renovations to the front door and lower entry way. We should also have the newly refurbished officers chairs completed sometime this month. I hope to see all of you in Lodge this month.

This event is limited to the first 45 respondents. No reservations will be accepted after May 1 so that we can provide the restaurant with an accurate count of attendees



Past Master Highlight Albert Herman Klingbeil 1931

Albert Herman Klingbeil was born March 11, 1870 in Pomerania, Germany. He migrated to America in 1882 and they settled in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. He moved to Oak Park, Illinois in 1891 and was employed as a cigar maker there. He married Alice Wendling June 28, 1894 in Oak Park, Illinois and they were the parents of three children, Emil Orson, Ruth and Willard Albert. He moved to Naper-ville in 1907 with his family and was employed as a cabinet maker for the Kroehler Furniture Manufacturing Company. He was raised a Master Mason October 6, 1920 in Euclid Lodge and served as Master of the Lodge in 1931. He died November 28, 1950 in Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois and was buried in the Naperville Cemetery.


