

ANNUAL MEETING

The Lodge will be holding its annual meeting and election of officers on Tuesday, November 5th. Reports will be given by the Master, Treasurer and Secretary.

Here is a brief rundown of my report which spans November 1, 2012 to October 31, 2013:

The Lodge held 10 stated meetings and 12 special meetings.

We initiated 17 Entered Apprentices, passed 10 Fellowcrafts and raised 9 Master Masons.

We started the year with 219 members. We had 1 death, 5 demits and 7 suspensions for non-payment of dues. We raised 9 Master Masons and had 2 affiliations. Our membership number is now 217.

We have one exempt member, ten fifty year members, sixty-one life members and 145 regular members.

Please contact Bro. Ory for additional information about upcoming chamber events that may be of interest to the membership.



Past Master Highlight Frederick Richard Kluckhohn 1948

Frederick Richard Kluckhohn was born November 21, 1891 in Reddick, Kankakee County, Illinois the son of Henry George Kluckhohn and Magdalene Hauswirth. He attended North Western College (North Central), graduating in 1917 with a BS degree. He was generally recognized as the best all-around athlete that had ever played for the college and served on the faculty of the college from 1917 to 1920 as Director of Athletics. He purchased the Keller Coal Business from his father-in-law in 1917 and operated it until about 1940 under the name of Fred R. Kluckhohn, Coal and Coke. He then went to work for the Illinois Department of Finance Retailers Occupation Tax Division in the DuPage County Clerks Office. He served as a Naperville Commissioner from 1927 to 1931 and again from 1947 to 1951. He married Agnes Betsy Marion Keller June 9, 1917 and they were the parents of three children, James Allen, Richard Keller and Betty Anne. He was raised a Master Mason May 25, 1917 in Euclid Lodge, and served as Master of the Lodge in 1948. He was exalted a Royal Arch Mason in Euclid Chapter No. 13, Royal Arch Masons on October 9, 1917 and served as High Priest in 1953. He died November 3, 1968 in Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois and was buried in the Naperville Cemetery.

Dinner started with an appetizer of Signature Crab Chowder with Crostini, followed by a wedge salad with candied bacon, brioche crouton, Mindira Bleu cheese and heirloom tomato. The attendees had their choice of the following entrees. Crab Cake with Red Pepper Roulle, grilled artichokes, roasted vegetables skewer with honey balsamic glaze and citrus herb risotto. 

WHAT HAS MASONRY DONE FOR THE WORLD

HEALTH

Some of the first hospitals and the first programs to provide income for families whose breadwinner was killed or disabled arose among the Masons of the Middle Ages (building sites give rise to many accidents!). In the United States, Masonic Lodges started many hospitals, most of which were later turned over to the communities as the population grew large enough to support them without Masonic assistance. Today, of course, Masonic involvement in health, especially the health of children is well known.

In some states, Masons have partnered with Prevent Blindness to support vision screening for school children and seniors. The Shrine's Children's Hospitals treat children who have orthopedic problems or serious burns. Research done at those facilities has helped many thousands of children live normal lives. Other bodies in the Masonic family support major research in diabetes, dementia, schizophrenia, cancer, and many other medical problems. The Masonic Drug Prevention Program has been hailed by officials of the federal government as one of the very few drug abuse prevention programs which actually works. One Grand Lodge has recently funded an Alzheimer's Disease laboratory at a major medical research facility.
