From The East - Carl F. Crownhart - Worshipful Master

Have you ever considered or desired change in the Illinois Grand Lodge Constitution or By-Laws? If so, how do you proceed? Are there guidelines or laws for direction? You may recall that in March this year we had cause to reschedule the stated meeting due to the forecast of heavy snows. Currently, the Master of the Lodge does not have the authority to make such change happen independently of a Dispensation from the Grand Master. There are good reasons for this but there are also good reasons to allow such action.

Heavy rains which caused flooding throughout the metro area this spring again caused many lodges to cancel or reschedule their meetings. A Dispensation was requested and was issued. In both cases, time was of the essence and good communications on the lodge level was mandatory so all brothers received the information.

So Euclid No. 65 is considering a change to the Constitution basically to give Worshipful Masters authority to reschedule meetings but under rigid and specific conditions.

The document to immediately reference is the *Book of Constitution* for procedure and quidance. You will always find a copy of it at the pedestal on the East Dais or, alternatively request it from the Secretary. Go to Code 97 for how to make changes to the Constitution, and Code 98 for similar to the By-Laws.

Neither is an easy path and in the case of Constitutional changes, these can be accomplished within a year but changes to the By-Laws will take longer. In both cases, approval by voting of the Grand Lodge Communication attendees is required and for the By-Laws changes, subsequent approval by individual lodges is also required. Coordination at the Grand Lodge level will be necessary to achieve cooperation for successful action.

Worshipful Brother Bill Dixon has been appointed as the chair of a Committee to research the issue and to make recommendations as to proposed changes. Brother Bill is very articulate and thorough especially for this type of material. He has made an initial proposal to me but in my opinion, more discussion needs to take place before submitting to the Grand Lodge.

In addition, A suitable proposal is not something which I believe will be completed in this Master's year. Therefore, if you have ideas or thoughts and some energy to participate, we would welcome you. Let Brother Bill or I know if you do.

Summer break is rushing at us and we're attempting to get everything possible done so a big backlog doesn't exist going into the fall. Would like to see you in lodge at the June Stated and the 3rd Degree conferral scheduled for June 18th.

Charles Benjamin Paver was born January 30, 1900 in Warrenville, DuPage County, Illinois the son of Edward Benjamin Paver and Mary A. Polivka. He married Esther Wallace April 19, 1924 in Wheaton, Illinois. He was a U. S. Postal worker at the Aurora Post Office and also served as Warrenville Fire Chief for 25 years. He was a past president of the Warrenville Lions Club and a trustee of the Warrenville Baptist Church. He was raised a Master Mason March 13, 1922 in Euclid Lodge and served as Master of the Lodge in 1944 and 1945. He was a Past Patron of Althea Chapter No. 206, Order of Eastern Star. He was also a member of Euclid Chapter No. 13, Royal Arch Masons. He died September 12, 1971 in Warrenville, DuPage County, Illinois and was buried in the Warrenville Cemetery.

WHAT HAS MASONRY DONE FOR THE WORLD

RIGHTS OF WORKERS

If you enjoy working an 8-hour day rather than a 16-hour day, thank Masonry. Earlier, workdays were from sunrise to sunset, and were extended even further when gaslight made it possible to artificially illuminate the workplace. But the Masonic ritual taught another revolutionary concept - that men and women were entitled to part of the day as their own. It taught that the day should be divided into three 8-hour parts, with 8 hours going to work, 8 hours going to the service of God and others, and 8 hours for rest and relaxation.

Masons like Samuel Gompers helped to make that a reality. The Masonic author Albert Pike taught in the rituals of the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry that an employer had responsibility to employees to see them well housed and well fed, that exploitation of workers or paying the lowest possible wage was morally indecent, and that the exploitation of women and children in factories was criminal.
