Did You Know?

July 1, 2013 marked the 150th anniversary of the start of the Battle of Gettysburg during the Civil War.

Euclid Lodge No. 65 and Euclid Chapter No. 13 members were not only present at the battle, but are credited with firing the first shot!

Marcellus Jones, a member of Wheaton Lodge No. 269 and Euclid Chapter No. 13, borrowed the rifle of Euclid Lodge No. 65 member Levi Shafer and fired the first shot that has been officially recognized as starting the battle.

Euclid Lodge No. 65 member and Past Master Alexander McSwain Sheridan Riddler was also present for the historic event.

A limestone marker, made from stone taken from the Naperville quarry marks the exact spot where Marcellus Jones, Levi Shafer and Alexander Riddler stood on the occasion. They were all members of Co. E, 8th Illinois Cavalry.



Joseph Naper Statue Dedication - August 23, 2013

Presentation by WM Carl Crownhart

The earliest known written record of freemasonry in the United States is in the archives of a lodge in Philadelphia, Pa. Although many prominent colonists are known to have been Masons before, this record is dated 1731. Fourteen Presidents have been members of the Masonic Fraternity, including George Washington.

Masonry spread rapidly after the war of independence as veterans pushed the frontier westerly as their settlements grew. In September 1848 a petition to charter a Masonic Lodge in Naperville was presented to Unity Lodge No. 48 in St. Charles for their approval and recommendation to the Grand Lodge of Illinois. This being granted, a committee of seven citizens headed by Joseph Naper, met and elected officers.

It was resolved that the oldest Mason present, Ezra Gilbert, would select a name for the proposed Lodge. He selected "Euclid" from the suggestions and that name endures today.

Euclid Lodge received its Charter on October 2, 1849 and first met on the upper floor of the DuPage County Cash Store. The first candidate of Masonry in Naperville, Eli Rich, received his degrees there. In 1852, when Joseph Naper was Worshipful Master of Euclid, the Lodge was moved to the third floor of Union Hall, later known as the Martin Becker Building. The Lodge remained there for five years. It moved to four other different locations in the downtown area over the ensuing years. However, in May of 1917 it moved to its present location at 34 West Jefferson Avenue.

Joe's four sons, Thomas, Mark, William and Robert along with his son -in-law Cheney Moses Castle and nephew Robert Nelson Murray were also members of the Lodge.

Masonic burial services for Worshipful Brother Naper were held in the Naperville Cemetery on August 24, 1862 with the usual Masonic simplicity. Today on the 151st anniversary of his death, Euclid Lodge is here to help Naperville dedicate the statue of one of our charter members, Worshipful Brother Joseph Naper. We thank you for the invitation and appreciate the opportunity to show how the City of Naperville and Euclid Lodge are historically integrated.

We invite you to an open house at the lodge immediately following these ceremonies.

Past Master Highlight THEODORE JOSEPH SIEVERT 1946

Theodore Joseph Sievert was born December 24, 1916 in Chicago, Cook County, Illinois the son of Herman William Sievert and Lillian E. Krueger. He came to Naperville in 1928 with his family and attended the public schools and later North Central College in the class of 1939. He married Bernice Kakacek August 19, 1936 in Naperville. Their wedding reception was held at the Masonic Lodge with Past Master Walter Houghton acting as the Master of Ceremonies. They were the parents of three children, Sandi, Theodore W. and Kenneth. He was first employed by the Kroehler Furniture Manufacturing Company as a Draftsman and retired as Chief Assistant Engineer. He was raised a Master Mason June 16, 1942 in Euclid Lodge and served as Master of the Lodge in 1946. He was a Past Patron of Althea Chapter No. 206 Order of Eastern Star. He died March 8, 2008 in Scottsdale, Maricopa County, Arizona.

WHAT HAS MASONRY DONE FOR THE WORLD

THE ARTS AND ARCHITECTURE

Freemasonry has had a strong influence on the art and architecture of the United States, especially on large public buildings and parks. Sir Christopher Wren, the architect responsible for the rebuilding of London after the great fire of 1666, is recorded as a Grand Master of Masons and many of the themes of the Masonic ritual and culture can be found in his designs. Those designs heavily influenced architecture for 150 years.

Basic Masonic themes which appear in architecture include design elements in groups of three, the use of equilateral triangles, the obelisk, and the vertical division of a building into three sections.

In music the works of Mozart, Hadyn, Sibelius, John Phillip Sousa, and W. S. Gilbert and Arthur Sullivan may be best known, but there are hundreds of Masonic composers in every genre from opera to rock. Organ builders recognize a "Masonic pipe organ" as a type of instrument in itself.

In literature, works by Masonic authors or featuring Masonic themes as War and Peace, The Man Who Would Be King, Kim, and the poetry of Robert Burns are well known. Contemporary works with Freemasonic themes (not all written by Masons) include science fiction such as The Artifact, Stranger in a Strange Land, The Cat Who Walked Through Walls, and the Star Wars movies. Masonry and its lessons have helped to shape the culture of the world.

From the Pamphlet "What Has Masonry Done for the World" Published by The Masonic Information Center
