Past Master Highlight Keith Irwin Hartzell 1950

Keith Irwin Hartzell was born March 17, 1919 in Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois the son of Almond Leroy Hartzell and Grace A. Enck. He married Helen Emily Berg about 1946 and they were the parents of two children, Roberta (Grippi) and Richard. He was first employed as an elevator operator in a hotel and later by the Kroehler Furniture Manufacturing Company as a Draftsman and Design Engineer for 44 years. He was a veteran of World War II, serving in the U.S. Army. He was also an avid golfer. He was raised a Master Mason March 31, 1945 in Euclid Lodge and served as Master of the Lodge in 1950. He was exalted a Royal Arch Mason February 12, 1946. He moved to Senatobia, Mississippi in 1993. He died June 17, 2000 in Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee and was buried in the Naperville Cemetery.

The Fahle of Truth

One of the greatest objects of Masonry is the eternal search for truth. This search is not isolated to Masonry. The search for truth is eternal. There is a beautiful fable or allegory of ancient Egypt in reference to truth.

lsis, the virgin truth, came into the world with her Divine Master. So perfect and beautiful was Isis or truth that the Divine Master left her in the care of the apostates.

Returning, the Divine Master created Osiris or knowledge. But a race of wicked deceivers conspired to destroy the virgin Isis.
While the apostates slept, the deceivers fell upon Isis and hacked and cut her lovely body into a thousand pieces and scattered them to the four winds of heaven.

When the Divine Master returned with Osiris (or knowledge) they found Isis missing. And ever since Osiris (or knowledge), has been searching the earth over and over, gathering up the pieces of Isis, the virgin truth, and putting them together, piece by piece, and in all these years, the world has been sad because knowledge can never be completed without truth.

We will always wonder if Osiris will ever wed Isis.

Although this is but an Egyptian fable, it is interesting to note how often the names Osiris and Isis are used in Egyptian references to God. There are many stories which use these names as characters in the religious teachings of Egypt.

In the BOOK OF THE DEAD (the Egyptian Bible), there are many stories, one of which tells of how Typhon murdered Osiris and buried him in the West.

Another reference which is of interest to the Masonic student tells of how Osiris represents the seed of fruit and Isis the earth, while Typhon represents the natural heat. Thus another fable is told of the death of Osiris, who is buried in the warm earth and once again procreation or immortality, life after death. Call it what you wish.
